**Need good reads?  
*Web site feature keeps library patrons  
up-to-date on new books and DVD releases***

Three Rivers Regional Library System has added an exciting resource to its Web site – BookLetters, a newsletter service featuring hot-off-the-press updates for readers interested in new fiction and nonfiction, fresh audiobooks and DVD releases, and bios of bestselling authors.

“BookLetters newsletters are a helpful tool for people hungry for new books to read,” said Leslie A. Jones, director of Three Rivers Regional Library System. Readers may browse the newsletters on the Three Rivers site at [www.trrl.org](http://www.trrl.org), or sign up to receive them in their e-mail accounts, Jones said.

One of the newsletters, “Libros en Español,” includes new books available in Spanish. Other newsletters target children and teens, as well as adult readers interested in romance, mystery, science fiction, and books related to history and current events.

The “Chapter a Day” newsletter has a link to a 30-minute audio clip from the popular Wisconsin Public Broadcasting program *Chapter a Day*. Readers can listen to the program at their convenience.

A “Check Our Catalog” link near each book, audiobook and DVD goes directly to the PINES online catalog, where readers can check to see if the items are available at their local libraries.

Three Rivers plans to use BookLetters technology to generate reading lists and newsletters promoting library events throughout the Three Rivers region, which includes Brantley, Camden, Charlton, Glynn, Long, McIntosh and Wayne counties.
