Nevada Barr is well known for her series of mystery novels set in national parks about Anna Pigeon, a law enforcement ranger who left Manhattan to join the National Park Service.

Nevada was born in the small western town of Yerington, Nevada, and raised on a mountain airport in the Sierras. She received her B.A. in speech and drama and her M.F.A in acting before moving to New York City, then Minneapolis. For 18 years she worked on stage, in commercials, industrial training films and radio. During this time she became interested in the environmental movement and began working in National Parks during the summers.

Throughout these careers, Nevada wrote and presented campfire stories, taught storytelling and was a travel writer and restaurant critic. Her first novel, *Bittersweet*, was published in 1983. *Track The Cat*, the first book of the Anna Pigeon Series, was brought to light in 1993 when she won both the Agatha and Anthony Awards for best first mystery ... and the rest is history.

Endangered Species, the fifth of the 15 Anna Pigeon mysteries, will pique local interest, as it is set on Cumberland Island's National Seashore. The New York Times Book Review stated "Despite the many plot complications that claim Anna's attention in this intricate mystery, Ms. Barr makes sure that she also has eyes for the eerie beauty of her isolated surroundings."

Nevada has numerous other books, short stories and articles to her credit. Her newly released *13-1/2* is a taut and terrifying psychological thriller connecting a series of decades-old murders to post-Katrina New Orleans.

Nevada Barr currently lives in New Orleans with her husband, four magical cats and two adorable dogs.
