**Downloadable audiobooks now available
Patrons can access free materials online at the library or at home**

BRUNSWICK — The member libraries of the Three Rivers Regional Library System are now offering free downloadable audiobooks to their patrons.

Library patrons in Brantley, Camden, Charlton, Glynn, Long, McIntosh and Wayne counties can now download free reading materials 24 hours a day, seven days a week through Georgia Download Destination, a consortium of Georgia public libraries. Patrons may browse and checkout downloadable audiobooks while using a library computer, or materials may be downloaded to a personal computer.

There are no late fees for downloaded audiobooks. At the end of the loan period, the titles will simply expire and be automatically “returned” to the library. Patrons then simply delete the expired files from their computers and other personal devices such as mp3 players.

To access the materials, patrons must have Internet access, a valid PINES library card from one of the Three Rivers member libraries and a PINES PIN or password. Links to instructions, system requirements and free software are available at www.trrl.org.
