Join us each Wednesday at the St. Marys Public Library for a little bit of cultural diversion with our weekly film series. Some films are old, some are new and some are just too unique not to show. Films start at 2:00 pm and 5:45 pm and are free to the public. Minors under the age of 17 must be accompanied by an adult. No Exceptions!

Wednesday, October 15th. "Diving Bell and the Butterfly" UK2008. Directed by Julian Schnabel. Starring Mathieu Amalric and Anne Consigny. When fashion editor Jean-Dominique Bauby suffers a stroke at the age of 45, he is left almost completely paralyzed. As he attempts to reconcile himself to his devastating condition, Bauby draws on his imagination to create a vivid inner world without limitations, and able to communicate only by blinking his left eye, begins the daunting task of dictating a book. This film is rated PG-13 for nudity, sexual content and some language. 112 minutes.

Wednesday, October 22nd. "The Other Side Of Sunday" Norway, 2000. Directed by Bert Neshem. Starring Marie Theisen, Bjorn Sundquest, Hildegun Ruse and Sylvia Salvesen. Maria, the vicar's daughter, figures out that by the time of her confirmation, she will have spent 640 hours sitting in church. And that's long enough! Maria does not want communion or the blood of Christ. She wants a soda at "the den of sin," her father's name for the local café. Maria longs for life. She wants to wear earrings, meet boys and go out with friends. *The Other Side of Sunday* is a beautiful, humorous, warm and sincere film about growing up when almost everything was forbidden. This film is not rated. Norwegian with English subtitles. 103 minutes.

Wednesday, October 29th. "Martian Child". USA 2008. Directed by Menno Meyjes. Starring John Cusack and Amanda Peet. John Cusack stars in this inspirational and uplifting journey as a lonely science-fiction writer who adopts a boy who claims to be from Mars. With the help of his quirky friend and his sister, this new father discovers that being a parent means that anything is possible. This film is rated PG for thematic elements and mild language. 107 minutes.

Wednesday, November 5th. "The Legend of Tillamook's Gold." USA 2008. Directed by Jane Beaumont Hall. Starring Brian McNamara, Brian Thompson and Julia Campbell. Julie, a lonely 14-year-old is in for the most amazing summer of her life when she finds an ancient coin on the beach and uncovers a local Native-American legend about a long-lost mountain treasure. With the help of her grandfather and his friend, Standing Elk, Julie embarks on a fantastic adventure to find Tillamook's gold. This film is rated G. 107 minutes.

Wednesday, November 12th. "Run Fat Boy Run" USA 2008. Directed by David Schwimmer. Starring Simon Pegg, Thandie Newton and Hank Azaria. It's the London Marathon, and thousands of feet pound along the Thames Embankment. Two of those feet belong to out of shape, out of luck Dennis Doyle. He is running to gain the respect (and hopefully the love) of Libby, the girl he left pregnant and heartbroken at the alter five years earlier. And running alongside Dennis is Libby's handsome, successful, self-confident and very fit new boyfriend. This film is rated PG-13 for some rude and sexual humor, nudity, language and smoking. 100 minutes.

Wednesday, November 19th "The Game Plan" USA 2008. Directed by Andy Fickman. Starring Dwayne "The Rock" Johnson. In this hilarious and heartwarming family comedy, one of sport's toughest players ever takes on his biggest challenge yet fatherhood! A superstar with an ego bigger than a football field, Joe Kingman is getting ready for a run at the big championship game when the 8 year old daughter he never knew existed shows up at his not-so-family-friendly bachelor pad. As the big game gets closer, he begins to realize the most meaningful win he can achieve is the heart of the one little fan who counts the most. This film is rated PG for some mild thematic elements. 110 minutes.
